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INSTRUCTIONS TO CANDIDATES

1. Fill in the OMR sheet carefully as per the instructions given on the back of the OMR Sheet / Admit Card. OMR sheet not correctly filled in will not be valued.
 2. Write your Roll Number (all eight digits) and Version as **A** on the Question Booklet and on the left hand side of the OMR sheet (basic data part).
 3. The examination consists of 100 Objective type multiple choice questions, which are to be answered in 90 minutes.
 4. After opening the Question Booklet ensure that there are 100 Questions and that the printing of all the questions are legible. If there are any missing or illegibly printed questions, the matter may be reported to the Invigilator immediately

A 2024 report from the American Psychological Association found that intentional breaks actually improve focus and output by up to 20%. When you pause, your brain isn't idle—it's quietly sorting information, making connections, and even solving problems in the background.

Think of it like letting a muddy glass of water settle; clarity returns when you stop stirring. Many of the world's most creative people, from Einstein to Steve Jobs, were famously fond of long walks and idle moments.

These pauses allowed their brains to wander and spark incredible ideas.

When you do nothing, your brain slips into what scientists call the "default mode network." This is when it processes memories, reflects on experiences, and forms new connections. According to research from Harvard Medical School in 2023, people who took regular breaks and let their minds wander remembered information 40% better than those who didn't.

It's like giving your mind a chance to breathe and organize itself, so you return to tasks sharper. That's why students are often advised to take breaks during study sessions—the brain needs downtime to lock in learning.
